CHURCH TO PARTICIPATE IN **CITY-WIDE EVANGELISM**


he church is now getting ready to participate in an all-out effort to reach the City of Los Angeles with the Word of God in 2009. The Southern California Conference is rallying all the churches within its territory and will be teaming up with It Is Written in two evangelistic campaigns: at the Pasadena City College Auditorium in February, 2009 and at the Shrine Auditorium in May, 2009. Shawn Boonstra, Speaker/Director for it Is Written Television Ministry will be the evangelist in both venues.

Inspirational programs and training workshops on how to reach out to people with the Word have been going on and will continue to be held until the start of the meetings.

Some of these scheduled programs include an evangelism rally at Central Filipino Church on April 26, 2008; a Conference-wide convocation on June 14, 2008 at the Los Angeles Convention Center and a Bible Worker Boot Camp at the White Memorial Church on June

20-22, 2008. In July and August, another evangelism training program called "Soup and Salvation" is scheduled to be held for 10 Tuesdays (and 10 Thursdays) at a place which shall be announced at a later time.

Churches throughout the Conference are being requested to send at least 10% of their regular Sabbath morning worship attendance to these training seminars. And all church members are asked to submit names and addresses of non-baptized relatives, family members and friends who have shown an interest in the message or who may have been baptized but have become inactive or stopped attending church services. This list should be submitted to the church pastor and will be sent to the It Is Written Television Ministry office so that contacts could be initiated.



MEET WITH JESUS ON FRIDAY NIGHTS

The Youth and Young Adult Ministries under new youth pastor Alvin Maragh started a new program called "Meet With Jesus". The one-hour program is held every Friday night from 7:00-8:00. A total of 54 were baptized at the end of a weeklong series of reaping evangelistic meetings which were held on February 17-23, 2008 in San Vicente, Palawan, Philippines.

Speaker for the series was CFC senior pastor Simeon Rosete, Jr. and it was coordinated by Dr. Felcar Morada, church evangelism ministry coordinator. It was also held in conjunction with AUP AWESNA medical outreach which was led by Dr. Alfonso Miguel, Jr., AUP AWESNA president and Dr. Morada, AUP AWESNA medical mission director.

The nightly meetings opened with a Voice of Prophecy graduation which saw 75 Bible students receive certificates for completion of the course. A children's story hour was part of the program and health lectures were presented prior to the nightly preaching. Drs. Dalisay Mina and Nemy Legaspi, Ricardo Peralta, Caesar Imperio and singing groups from the local congregation provided music for the meetings.

Before the 37-member evangelistic/medical team left San Vicente, they had the opportunity to visit the famous Underground River and Caves, the Iwahig Penal Colony, the Crocodile Farm and a number of the beautiful beaches and islands that Palawan is known for.

We were about ready to call it a day at our hotel in Boracay Beach when we got word that my motherin-law was admitted at the hospital.

We cut our excursion short and went to visit her the next day. Since the doctor said that all she needed were daily doses of antibiotics and a continuous supply of oxygen, we decided to have her discharged and let her have her treatment at home.

For about four days, she seemed to be OK. And we hoped it was just a matter of time before the daily treatment would take care of the fluids that have settled in her lungs. She even managed to dress-up for a photo-session with her family that Thursday; and on Friday when I got up to go to the living room early in the morning, I found her up early singing a praise song to God. Who would have known that on that same day, she would be overtaken by seizures and would breathe her last?

It's the uncertainty and fragile nature of life. My wife and I and her sister and niece from Toronto (Canada) had planned to spend some time with her, this year being the year she turns 80. But what was expected to be days of fun and laughter turned out to be a time of mourning. And what was planned to be an advance birthday celebration turned out to be a funeral.

We can only thank God for allowing her to live a long and fruitful life; and a life that has been lived to the glory of God and the blessing of fellowman. Most of all we thank God for the blessed hope – the second coming of Christ and the resurrection of those that fell asleep in Jesus. We know we shall see our loved ones again on that great resurrection morning.

CHURCH OFFICERS HOLD RETREAT AT THOUSAND OAKS

Close to 100 church officers and their spouses attended the Church Officers' Weekend Retreat which was held at the Palm Garden Hotel in Thousand Oaks, California on January 5-6, 2008.

The presentations were made by CFC senior pastor Simeon Rosete, Jr. and they focused on the mission of the church and what role the officers play in the accomplishment of their mission. The pastor also did a presentation on what conditions should exist in a local congregation for church growth to happen.

In an evaluation done following the weekend retreat, respondents expressed appreciation for the relevance and practicality of the materials presented and suggested that this type of retreat be done on a yearly basis.

The Early Morning Worship Service is designed to meet the spiritual needs of every member of the congregation who comes to worship each Sabbath. It sets the tone for the day's worship services and provides a perfect transition to the Sabbath School program and the rest of the day's activities.
